GIL CATES AND LOUIS HORVITZ, who received eight Emmy noms for their credits as producer and director respectively for the critically-praised 75th Oscar show, will reunion this week in New York to huddle with CBS about the web's 75th anni show. Horvitz got word of his Emmy noms last week while at the **Ischia** Global Film and Music Festival. Horvitz, who studied the great Italian film directors while at UCLA, says he's been approached to do a film -- but frankly admits he can't take the year and a half minimum to do one -- as he's got a regular, hefty program of TV specials. These include again directing the Emmys, for which he's also nominated. (He once had to leave the booth to accept a win!) And he's also again directing "An Evening of Stars" for the United Negro College Fund...With his Emmy nom, Paul Newman probably rates a nod in the Guinness Book of World Records: in the past 12 months, he's been nommed for the Oscar, Emmy, Tony and Golden Globe.
